ABOUT THE ESTATE

- Académie is a Willamette Valley Pinot Noir and Chardonnay project founded by Thomas Savre and Joshua Wludyka with Dominique Lafon and Bertrand de Villaine.
- Thomas Savre brings Burgundian training and more than a decade of winemaking experience in the Willamette Valley to the project.
- Académie explores terroir not only through vineyard sites, but also through the people, relationships, and decisions that shape the wines.
- Académie focuses on limited-production wines made for aging, while Ostia Tempore offers a more immediate and generous expression of Thomas' work.
- The goal is not to reproduce Burgundy in Oregon, but to apply rigor, curiosity, and close attention to the Willamette Valley.

HARVEST & VINIFICATION

Whole cluster native yeast fermentation. Aging in French oak. 3.5 pH.
